




## *Mission Statement*

# Peralta Police Services

Deputies are assigned from 0600 hours to 2400 hours, seven days a week. Sheriff's Technicians are assigned 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

On occasion, we are assisted by deputies from A.C. Transit, Airport Police and the Marine Patrol Unit.



The Alameda County Sheriff's Office is a full service law enforcement agency nationally accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA).



## **What does this mean?**

The Sheriff's Office has met 462 standards set by the Commission. We have a set of written directives which govern how we do business.

We have a system of checks and balances when it comes to our employees and we have a positive relationship with every community we serve, including Peralta Community College District.



## LAW ENFORCEMENT DUTIES, CONTINUED

- In addition to their regular police functions, the deputies provide security at football games, basketball games, and board meetings. Sheriff's technicians, in addition to their regular duties in the monitor room and the issuance of citations, also deliver financial aid checks and payroll checks to the four campuses.
- In addition to our regular police functions, deputies assist General Counsel with obtaining and serving Restraining Orders and conduct on-going investigations.

## LAW ENFORCEMENT DUTIES, CONTINUED

- One such investigation involves a district employee who has been receiving harassing phone calls from a former co-worker from her former employer. While there is no direct connection to the District, our deputies are conducting a thorough investigation and are going to send the case to the DA for complaint.
- In another incident, we became aware that an district-owned laptop may have contained illicit/illegal material. We obtained the computer and delivered it to our forensic computer expert where it was analyzed.

## LAW ENFORCEMENT DUTIES, CONTINUED

In the past, Sundays were days when minimum staffing could be employed; however, with the Laney Flea Market and classes being held at Merritt and COA, the calls for service on Sundays are as common as any other day.

Calls for service have more than doubled from 2006 to 2008.






# 2007 Campus Crime Statistics



# 2007 Campus Crime Statistics




# 2007 Campus Crime Statistics



# Noteworthy Events




- On January 25, 2008, deputies were detailed to the Laney College Parking Lot for a report of vehicle tampering. A safety Aid gave a detailed description of the suspect. A search of the area revealed a suspect, who fit the description.

A black bag containing a catalytic converter and burglary tools was recovered near by. The suspect was arrested and served 4 months in the County Jail.

# Noteworthy Events

- On April 9, 2008, a female Laney Student said she was groped by a man in the library in what was described as an attempted sexual battery. She had seen the man on previous occasions and described him as “looking like a rat,” among other descriptors. The following week, Deputies Calegari and Brown saw a suspect on the Laney Campus fitting this description. He was identified and made a spontaneous statement regarding the incident.


A photograph line-up was made and the victim positively identified the suspect. A warrant was issued for his arrest and he subsequently pleaded guilty in court.




# Noteworthy Events

- In April 2008, deputies identified a student, who had been leaving notes in the bathrooms of Laney and Merritt College indicating that he was going to rape and murder women and bomb the schools.

The student was arrested by Peralta deputies and convicted of Criminal Threats.


- On Thursday, May 8, 2008, Deputy Glenn Pace was patrolling the Laney student parking lot when he observed two male juveniles looking over the fence from the nearby park. They looked to be “casing” the vehicles in the lot. Both were dressed in black hooded sweat jackets with the hoods concealing their faces.

Deputy Pace detained the two and during a subsequent pat search, located a shaved key. A third suspect was located on the adjacent surface street. He admitted to being a lookout and told deputies the other two were looking to “steal a Volvo.”

All three were arrested and subsequently NTA'd for Att.10851 VC; 466 PC; 182 PC and 11359 H&S.

# Noteworthy Events

- On Thursday, May 15, 2008, a Laney student contacted Deputy Pace and told him he had found a video camera hidden under a bench in the stall of a toilet in the Men's Locker Room. Deputy Pace took custody of the camera and upon viewing it, he saw the suspect setting up the camera and positioning it so as to record the toilet area. Deputy Pace recognized the suspect as a student. When interviewed, he made incriminating admissions; however, he refused to give a formal statement. A complaint of 647(j)(2) was sought from the DA.






# Noteworthy Events


- On May 27, 2008, Deputies Bock and Dickinson investigated the theft of a \$2000.00 Plasma Torch from the Laney College metal shop. The torch had several unique features and was recognized on *eBay*.

After getting the address of the person selling the torch, a search warrant was written for the San Lorenzo residence.

On June 10, 2008, Sergeants Tucker and Harrison and Deputies Bock and Dickinson, et al; served the search warrant. The torch was recovered and a former Laney student was arrested.


- On July 22, 2008, members of the Alameda County Narcotics Task Force, the Oakland Police Department, the Drug Enforcement Administration and Peralta Police Services served search warrants on two locations. Both locations were known residences of members of the Oakland Chapter of the Hell's Angels Motorcycle Club.

The information for the search warrants was obtained as a direct result of a month long investigation by Sergeant Dan Harrison, and Deputies Tamur Dickinson, Tom Bock and Von Wissmiller. Some time in mid June, the aforementioned Peralta Police Deputies detected a strong odor of fresh marijuana emanating from the area of E. 12th Street and 5th Ave, which is one block from the Laney College Daycare Center.

As a result of the search warrants, 59 marijuana plants, 6 firearms (one stolen), \$21,000.00 in cash, and indicia were seized and six persons were arrested. Among the six, were two members of the Oakland Hell's Angels Chapter.

# Noteworthy Events

- On October 28, 2008, six members from a group known as *Survivors of the Abortion Holocaust* staged an unauthorized protest at the College of Alameda in the quad area. The protesters erected two large pictures boards showing photos of unborn/partially aborted fetuses. They handed out anti-abortion literature to students.




- The protesters did not have a permit and refused to disperse the campus. Three of the protesters were arrested for 626.6 PC (Remaining on campus after being directed to leave)

The Survivors of the Abortion Holocaust is a nationwide anti-abortion group and visit at least 100 colleges a year and set up demonstrations.



# Noteworthy Events

- On October 20, 2008, Deputies Pace and Brown responded to the Laney College Library for a report of a 314.1 PC. Deputy Pace contacted the victim who told them a black male adult had exposed himself to her and fled down the stairwell.
- Deputy Brown detained a suspect matching the description given by the victim. The suspect was positively identified by the victim and arrested for 314.1 PC.
- The victim from a previous 314.1 PC was contacted for a photo lineup, but was unable to identify the suspect. The suspect was charged with 314.1 PC.





# URBAN SHIELD


- Local law enforcement must constantly assess its ability to cope with and manage large scale events. Intentional incidents such as the Oklahoma city bombing or the Columbine High School and Virginia Tech University massacres remind us that we can never become complacent.



# URBAN SHIELD

- Urban Shield is a one-of-a kind, full-field 50 hour continuous exercise intended to bring the components of the National Response Plan to life in Alameda, Contra Costa and San Francisco counties.

Hosted by the Alameda County Sheriff's Office, twenty-four different scenarios are set up throughout the greater Bay Area to evaluate our regional response to real world emergencies and critical incidents. The exercise is designed to test the physical and mental skills of the participating tactical team members by systematically incorporating various levels of stress, anxiety, and physical exhaustion.
