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# BCC 2007 Equity Plan Goal 1: STUDENT ACCESS – Success Stories

Between 2006/7 and 2008/9

- BCC Annual headcount increased by 42% from 6,921 to 9,808. (*State increase – 11.5%*)
- The representation of ethnic minorities increased from 68% to 70%. (*State increase – from 65% to 66%*)
- Disabled students increased by 21% from 365 to 442. (*State increase – 17%*)
- EOPS/CARE serves over 400 students annually, while the state only funds 160.

# Persistence Rates – Success Stories

## **EOPS**

**Persistence:** EOPS students show greater persistence rate both in 2007 and 2008 than the college average (70.3% vs. 64.5%, and 67.3% vs. 65.4%, respectively).

## **DSPS**

**Retention (Census to Semester End):** BCC PSSD students' retention rates were approximately 10% higher than those of the non-PSSD students.

**Persistence:** BCC PSSD students' average 3-year persistence rate (72%) is approximately 20% higher than the rate of non-PSSD students (52%).

# Goal 4: Degree and Certificate Completion, 2007/8

EOPS graduates make up about 30% of BCC's Certificate and Associate Degree recipients.

Transfer is an important focus for BCC. BCC is ranked third in the state on this Student-Right-To-Know measure (behind only Orange County). Rates are percentages of students who transfer, calculated on cohorts of first-time, full-time award and transfer students who are tracked for a three year period.

New curriculum 2008-09 and 2009-2010

# Innovative and Proactive Student Services at BCC

- **Outreach/In-reach and Student Ambassador Program.**
- **Expended Tutoring.** The number of students served by LRC has increased by 82% in a 3-year period, from 1,448 in 2006-07 to 2,628 in 2008-09.
- **Proactive Counseling.** The number of student served by counseling increased significantly over a three-year period, from 2,234 to 7,992.
