

ARNOLD G. FONG

Arnold George Fong is a fourth generation American whose great-grandfather helped build the Southern Pacific Railroad in the 1800s. His grandfather was the first Chinese-American to be buried in a Christian cemetery in Sacramento. His father is among the first Chinese-Americans to reach the rank of full colonel in the US Air Force.

Thus, Arnold has deep roots in this country and his family has played a part in building a vital country and community. It is not surprising then that Arnold is an activist in the community, working to empower Asian Americans and to advocate for social justice issues.

His passions –immigrant rights, diversity, and youth leadership development - are reflected in his accomplishments that include:

- Board Member, APA Democratic Caucus of Alameda County
- A founder of the Organization of Alameda Asians, an Asian empowerment organization in Alameda where one third of the City's residents are Asian American. He is currently the President of the OAA.
- Co-Chair of the East Bay Asian Voter Education Consortium, an organization that works on voter education and registration activities. Their activities helped to increase the voter turnout in Oakland Chinatown from 25% to 40% in the November 2002 general election.
- Past Board Member of the Alameda Multi-cultural Community Center
- Member of the City of Alameda Mayor's Hate Violence Council
- Member of Alameda County's Long Term Care Steering Group, appointed by Wilma Chan
- Certificate of Recognition as a Minority Entrepreneur by former Assembly Member Barbara Lee
- Founding member of the Asian Community Basketball Association
- Board member, Community Development Institute, Buena Vista United Methodist Church

He carries these passions into his professional work as well. Recognizing the importance of providing information in the language spoken by the patients who come to his pharmacy, Arnold provides in-depth medication consultations in Cantonese, Mandarin, VietNameese, and translates prescription labels in Chinese. 

Calvin Fong has a long history of community involvement in the East Bay and a with governance and administration in the City of Berkeley. Between 1996 and 2002, he served as an council aid to Berkeley City Council members Margaret Breland and Linda Maio. Beginning in 2002, Fong joined the staff of newly elected mayor Tom Bates. In 2008 he was promoted to the position of Senior.

Fong's chief responsibilities in the Mayor's office now include monitoring individual development projects, affordable housing projects, and land use and transportation policy development. He was instrumental in helping to secure funding for the almost-completed Ed Roberts Campus disability rights center. He also staffs Mayor Bates on various regional boards and commissions including: the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC); the Bay Area Air Quality Management District (BAAQMD); and the Bay Conservation and Development Corporation (BCDC) where the focus has been on implementation of SB 375 to significantly reduce green house gas emissions.

Fong, a graduate of Berkeley High School, holds a Masters degree in Business Administration (Cal State East Bay, 1987). He has a long history of involvement in East Bay community politics. He is a board member of the Asian Pacific American Democratic Caucus of Alameda County, a member of both the National Women's Political Caucus and the Wellstone Democratic Club and is active in local Democratic Party politics. He also is the treasurer of the Canyon Oaks Home Owners Association.

Calvin has been married to Victoria Laurel-Fong for 23 years. They have one child, Justin, who is a senior in college.

FELIX GALAVIZ

BIOGRAPHICAL BRIEF

Felix Galaviz is the Co-founder and former Senior Executive Director of the State Puente Project, sponsored by the University of California Office of the President and the California Community Colleges. Puente operates in over 56 California community colleges and over 35 high schools. In 2004, Felix Galaviz took early retirement to explore new interests in organization and leadership development.

In 1981, Mr. Galaviz co-designed, taught, and conducted the first Puente Project at Chabot College, Hayward. Mr. Galaviz co-created the Puente teacher/counselor training program that trained teams to replicate the program throughout California. Puente uses cultural based methodologies to enrich student academic achievement and success.

Mr. Galaviz has given numerous presentations on education, counseling and mentoring Hispanic youth. He served on a national think tank of the Education Trust's counseling reform project and on the Hitachi Foundation's Yoshiyama Scholarship Committee. He has served as president of the Hispanic Chamber of Commerce of Alameda County and chaired numerous community organizations. In 1990, Mr. Galaviz was one of fifty California Hispanic leaders invited to meet with President George Bush at the University of California, Los Angeles on Hispanic educational concerns. In 1995, he provided testimony to the President's Advisory Commission and White House Initiative on Educational Excellence for Hispanic Americans.

Mr. Galaviz received his bachelor's degree in social science from the University of California, Berkeley and his master's degree in educational psychology/counseling from California State University, Hayward. At Chabot College, he served as assistant dean for student personnel services. He co-authored several articles on the Puente Project unique to underserved student populations.

Mr. Galaviz has received a number of leadership awards in recognition of his service to the community, his commitment to higher education and his innovative efforts in establishing a national educational model for Hispanic students. In 1994, he was recognized with a resolution from the U.S. House of Representatives. In 1998, Mr. Galaviz was recognized at the White House, by Vice President Al Gore when the Puente Project was selected as one of ten winners of the Innovations in American Government Award, sponsored by the Ford Foundation, the Council for Excellence in Government and the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University.

Mr. Galaviz is currently serving as Chief Executive Officer for the Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, Alameda County and the Hispanic Business, Education and Training Inc. is a member on the Oakland Youth Law Academy, and is Chair of the California Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, Northern Regional Scholarship Program. In addition, he served as Co-Principle investigator for the Chabot Community College National Science Foundation Grant and a member of the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District Bond Oversight Committee. He is a Vietnam veteran and a recipient of two Purple Hearts.


Dear Walter,
