


- ✓ EasyPass is available to all eligible students at a 96% discount from regular fair.
- ✓ Students who voted for the EasyPass approved the referendum by 88%
- ✓ EasyPass is a great alternative to driving alone. It reduces parking demands and alleviates traffic congestion.
- ✓ All eligible students during the Spring semesters will have a valid EasyPass throughout the summer.
- ✓ EasyPass is now accepted on BART, Golden Gate Transit, San Francisco Muni, and the Dumbarton Express. To ride these other systems you WILL need to add cash (called "e-cash") to your card.

Ridership Data



Since Fall 2009, there have been over **2.3 million rides** taken by PCCD students

Fall 2010

- Of the **27,246** students enrolled at the end of the Fall 2010 semester, **9,659** were enrolled in **9 or more units** (35%)
- Of those **9,659** students, an average of **4,196** (43%) used their passes an average of **134,515** times per month (September-December)

Spring 2011

- Of the **28,112** students currently enrolled at PCCD, there are **10,204** students enrolled in **9 or more units** (36%)
- Of those **10,204** students, **4,413** (43%) used their passes a total of **147,328** times in April 2011





Card Distribution



- Based on my meeting with AC Transit last week, for those students who pay or enroll in 9 units after the semester begins, **AC Transit will mail the cards** directly to the individual college cashiers' offices twice weekly for distribution
- All Lost/Stolen/Replacement cards will be mailed directly to the **student address**. In situations where delivery by mail is not possible, students will be able to pick up their cards at the **AC Transit Ticket Office**.

Background and Needs



- In 2007, PCCD commissioned a needs assessment to evaluate the need for expanded campus-based health services
- Findings indicated:
 - Majority of students lacked a usual source of care for health services and had no insurance
 - Students requested an expansion of health services to include:
 - ✦ primary care- doctor's visits (46%)
 - ✦ women's health (36%)
 - ✦ immunizations (32%)

Asian Health Services

- Facilitate development of site-based health clinics at PCCD campuses

- Develop leveraging plan for additional funding from other sources besides the Student Health Fee

- Provide facilities, resources, & materials towards health services, including administration of student health fees

Budget



- Collections from the health fee from students were approximately **\$642,000 for Fall 2010 and Spring 2011**.
- To run a **20-hour per week clinic** at Laney costs about **\$400,000** per year (year –round).
 - District expenses include personnel cost of a Health Services Director and a Director of the Peralta Wellness Center at Laney College, and **\$100,000** per year for additional liability insurance.
- To date, we have sufficient funds to cover our operational expenses.



Facilities



- The Peralta Wellness Center at Laney College will be built in stages:
 - The first interim facility was opened in the Student Center in December, 2010
 - A permanent facility at Laney College is in the discussion and planning stage
- Peralta Wellness Centers at the other colleges are part of the Student Health Services Strategic Plan



Services



- Physical exams
- Birth Control
- STI & HIV testing
- Pap smears
- TB testing
- Vaccinations
- Flu shots
- Health Ed
- Urgent Care Referrals
- Public Insurance Screening & Enrollment Services: (e.g. FamilyPACT, Medi-Cal)

NOTE: For underinsured or students with existing insurance, additional fees apply for laboratory tests, pharmacy, and x-ray services not provided at the Peralta Wellness Center.



Utilization



Clinical Services to Date:

- **426 visits** have been seen in the Peralta Wellness Center
 - *218 patients*
- Projections with 1 provider and 2 exam rooms, 2 days per week=**1500 visits** and approximately **500-750 patients**

Distribution of Students by Campus

- ✦ **COA** 5% (**11**)
- ✦ **Merritt** 10% (**21**)
- ✦ **BCC** 11% (**24**)
- ✦ **Unspecified** 26% (**56**)
- ✦ **Laney** 48% (**104**)

Financial Aid Updates



- Financial Aid services will streamline the process by moving from SAFE (legacy) to SAFE-Web
 - Peralta IT will program PeopleSoft to integrate with SAFE-Web
 - Product testing will begin Fall 2011
 - Projected Go-live in January 2012 for award year 2012-13

- Colleges are currently collecting eligibility documents for Fall 2011
 - All students must apply for Financial Aid or the Board of Governor's (BOG) Fee Waiver online at www.fafsa.ed.gov

- 2011-12 Peralta Financial Aid Handbook has been completed and is online for students to access

- Student BOGG and Verification documents available for download on College Financial Aid websites

- IT and Financial Aid are also working on Student Debit cards to replace paper checks to streamline business/operational process
 - Pre-Authorization by the student for any fee deductions will be required



Financial Aid Audits



2008-09 FEDERAL PROGRAM REVIEW

- BCC Program Review was complete in March, 2011
- Audit exception response was sent to USDE regarding Consumer Information finding in April, 2011

2009-10 STATE

- Financial Aid Offices are prepared for Cal Grant Audit the week of May 23, 2011
- All required documentation was submitted to the California Student Aid Commission
- Each College will be audited

RESULT OF 2009-10 PERALTA SINGLE AUDIT REPORT

- No Financial liability
- Two Findings:
 - Merritt Direct Loans Inaccurate Reconciliation Dates
 - Late submission of Return to Title IV

Solutions to Findings:

- Direct Loan Reconciliation now performed directly thru Financial Aid system
- Return to Title IV procedure being followed by all colleges to ensure timely submission of data

INFORMATION TO BE DISTRIBUTED TO ALL STUDENTS

Payment Policy

- Students must pay all applicable fees no later than two (2) weeks before the beginning of the term. Failure to do so will result in classes being dropped. Students who add classes after this deadline are required to pay their fees immediately or a hold WILL be placed on the student's account and the debt will be sent to collections.

Payment Deadline

- Tuition and enrollment fees are due and payable at the time of registration, and each time you add subsequent classes

- In-Person at the Cashier's Office
- By Mail (Check or money order payable to PCCD)
- Online By Credit/Debit Card (Visa or MasterCard)
- Payment plans are available upon request

Financial Aid

- All students must apply for Financial Aid or the Board of Governor's (BOG) Fee Waiver online at www.fafsa.ed.gov
- When picking up financial aid checks, all fees, including AC Transit EasyPass fees, will be collected before checks are released. (Students may authorize PCCD to use Financial Aid for these charges)
