ITEM TITLE:

Consider Approval of a 1-month extension to the Independent Contractor Agreement with Dr. Mark Martin dba Design4X, Inc. for services to be rendered pursuant to grant management of the San Francisco Foundation funded project in Advanced Manufacturing for Laney College.

SPECIFIC BOARD ACTION REQUESTED:

Consider approval of a 1-month extension (until 1/31/2013) for independent contractor agreement for Dr. Mark Martin (doing business as Design4X, Inc). Original contract was from February 2012 – December 2012.

The contract amount will change from not to exceed \$110,000 to not to exceed \$118,000. This is to provide project management services for Laney College's grant from the San Francisco Foundation for Advanced Manufacturing and Industrial Maintenance education at the college.

Source of funds: Bay Area Workforce Funding Collaborative (BAWFC) / San Francisco Foundation. All Board recommended contracts are subject to negotiation and execution by the Chancellor.

ITEM SUMMARY:

Laney College has been given a one-month grant extension of its San Francisco Foundation grant until January 31, 2013.

Dr. Martin (doing business as Design4X, Inc.) will continue to provide project management services to this project until January 31, 2013. The contract amount will change from not to exceed \$110,000 to not to exceed \$118,000. This is to provide project management services for Laney College's grant from the San Francisco Foundation for Advanced Manufacturing and Industrial Maintenance education at the college. Dr. Mark Martin has been acting in this role since February 2012. Prior to that he was the California CTE Director for Manufacturing, Engineering and Technology career pathways the Center for Applied Competitive Technologies at City College of San Francisco.

Martin has a Ph.D. in Mechanical Engineering from Stanford University, an MS in Mechanical Engineering from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), and an MBA from the Sloan School of Management at MIT. Martin has demonstrated expertise in manufacturing project management, Six Sigma for engineering, online course development, K-12 educational program development for manufacturing and engineering, and development and delivery of advanced curriculum in manufacturing design and engineering. Martin has been on faculty of Stanford University in the School of Engineering. Martin has provided business consulting services to major manufacturers such as Hewlett Packard, Sun Microsystems, Cisco Systems, and Toshiba.

BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:

Dr. Martin will provide project management services in support of the critical mission of Laney College and the

Peralta District to offer high quality educational program opportunities for the communities served within the Bay Area region.

DELIVERABLES AND SCOPE OF WORK:

Dr. Martin will provide a range of project management services to Laney College focused on expanding and strengthening Laney’s interdisciplinary Industrial Maintenance Technology program and its Advanced Manufacturing program.

Martin will provide extensive employer outreach to area manufacturers, utilities, and energy producers to benchmark curriculum content and to develop employment opportunities for Laney students.

Martin will coordinate Laney’s regional collaboration with the Bay Area Manufacturing Renaissance Council (BAMRC), the Career Ladders Project, the Oakland Unified School District, the East Bay Economic Development Alliance, the California Manufacturing and Technology Association, and the Manufacturing Institute. Martin will also coordinate Laney’s National Institute for Metalworking Skills (NIMS) accreditation process. Martin will also develop a Bay Area Manufacturing Association (BAMA) to support Laney’s advanced manufacturing program. Martin will also coordinate the formalization of a linkage between Laney College and McClymonds High School’s Advanced Manufacturing Academy so that high school students in West Oakland have a direct curricular pathway to Laney in advanced manufacturing. In addition, Martin will track and report performance outcomes for the San Francisco Foundation grant, prepare grant reports, and administer grant activities.

Martin will manage two of Laney’s recent grants – the state Chancellor’s Office Industry Driven Regional Collaborative (IDRC) grant to establish machining apprenticeships in the Bay Area, and the U.S. Department of Labor Advanced Manufacturing Accelerator grant.
