Associate of Arts Degree for Transfer in Anthropology AA-T Degree Laney College

The Associate in Arts Degree in Anthropology for Transfer is designed to prepare students for a seamless transfer with junior status and priority admission to their local CSU campus to a program or major in Anthrpology or similar major for completion of a baccalaureate degree. Students are required to complete: ? a minimum of 27 semester units in the major with a grade of C or better while maintaining a minimum grade point average (GPA) of at least 2.0 in all CSU transferable coursework. ? 60 semester CSU-transferable units using the California State University-General Education-Breadth pattern (CSU-GE Breadth); OR the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) pattern. ? No more than 60 semester units are required. The Associate in Arts Degree in Anthropology for Transfer will also assist Anthropology major students to transfer to a U.C. or other baccalaureate institutions. Students are advised to consult with a counselor to verify transfer requirements.
