




Peralta CCD awarded \$15 million

Peralta is the fiscal lead of a regional Consortium comprised of 11 school districts, 6 community colleges in three districts, 4 WIBs, the Alameda County Office of Education, 2 Regional Occupation Programs (ROPs) and industry partners along the I-80/880 Corridor in the East Bay region including:

- The Peralta Colleges (Berkeley City College, College of Alameda, Laney College and Merritt College) Chabot College

Our proposal includes creating 22 new and strengthening 33 existing regional pathway programs

Our region currently serves 12,206 students in pathway programs. We estimate they will serve 18,068 in 2017-18 (a growth rate of nearly 50%) in the following industry sectors:

- Health & Bio Science
- Information Communication Technology (ICT)/Digital Media
- Engineering & Advanced Manufacturing
- Public Services

We will build regional infrastructure to support career pathways & smooth transitions to college

- A data sharing platform (CalPass Plus) and agreements that will allow us to monitor and facilitate student success over time.
- A regional industry engagement platform to help scale up the number of work-based learning opportunities and job placements.
- On-going regional collaboration systems to continue to strengthen the pipeline of successful students (using multiple measures, dual enrollment, and other strategies to align K12 and community college systems).
