SIATech Awarded \$6 million California Career Pathways Trust (CCPT) Grant

The School for Integrated Academics and Technologies (SIATech) today earned a California Career Pathways Trust (CCPT) Grant from the California Department of Education to provide opportunities for out-of-school students to earn 21st century skills and certifications needed to successfully transition from high school into college and high-wage careers. The program's goal is to provide Opportunity Youth with access to the middle class through STEM college and career pathways.

College of Alameda is one of SIATech's Community College partners who will play a collaborative role in assisting SIATech students, specifically the students located at the Treasure Island campus, to make a successful transition from high school to College of Alameda so all students can realize their full potential.

College of Alameda will:

- Identify appropriate credit-bearing college courses and dual enrollment courses in a career pathway to prepare students to enter postsecondary without need for remediation.
- Provide pathways with multiple jumping off points to provide access to industry recognized certification options and Associate degree programs.
- Assist in identifying internships/WBL opportunities.
